# ALAM ANDA HOUSE REEF

**VISIBILITY: 15-20M**  
**CURRENT: MILD - MODERATE**

Our guests don't have to go far to enjoy one of the best dive sites in Indonesia. Alam Anda's House Reef is the perfect shore dive site for beginners and advanced divers. Divers can discover a diverse wealth of marine life just in front of the resort. Indeed, the House Reef top is especially loved by photographers as it bears a wide variety of subjects. The shallow area is around 6 meters and stretches to 50 meters from the beach. If the sea is calm this place is also great for snorkelers and freedivers. The bottom of the reef drops away at approx. 45° to greater depths. Its particular topography makes the reef protected from the current and therefore it bears an amazing contrast between the white sand and all different kind of soft and hard corals, sponges, and sea fans. Divers can see tropical reef fish such as blue-spotted stingrays, leaf fish, moray eels, lionfish, long-nose hawkfish, ghost pipefish, shrimps, and several types of sea slugs. If you're lucky you can even see sea turtles, eagle rays, and during night dives Spanish Dancers. A truly heavenly place for divers.

Strong currents are rare and the water temperature varies according to the seasons between 27 and 29 °C.

# TULAMBEN USAT LIBERTY

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**VISIBILITY: 15-20M**  
**CURRENT: NONE - MODERATE**  
**40 MIN FROM ALAM ANDA**



Tulamben has become one of Bali's most famous diving areas due to the Liberty wreck. This shipwreck is one of the most easily-dived wrecks in the world. Located just 25 meters from the shore, and resting between 5 – 30 meters deep, it is accessible to all levels and a variety of divers and even snorkelers and freedivers can enjoy this enchanting wreck.

In 1942, the USAT Liberty was torpedoed by the Japanese while stationing off the strait of Lombok. Damaged, the American Navy towed the ship towards Bali but on the way to Singaraja, the ship began to break apart and instead was beached onto the shore of Tulamben.

In 1963, the earthquakes caused by the volcanic eruption of Mount Agung pushed the ship into the ocean where it sank. Since then marine life of all colors, shapes, and sizes has colonized the 120 meter-long vessel. The wreck lays at a 90-degree angle with the deck facing the seaside and turned into a home for an extraordinary number of fish, coral, and invertebrates. This is a world-class site and is not to be missed.



# TULAMBEN CORAL GARDEN

**VISIBILITY: 15-25 M**  
**CURRENT: NONE - MODERATE**  
**40 MIN FROM ALAM ANDA**

From the beach, just south of the wreck lays the perfect dive sites for macro lovers. It drops slowly from 2-15 m and is a young reef, wonderfully covered with hard- and soft corals, many sea squirts, and feather stars. The flora and fauna here are very rich and also abundant, even in the shallows.

Several artificial reef structures attract a large number of fishes, including species such as damselfish, butterflyfish, and surgeonfish, and also important numbers of “cleaning stations” where morays, groupers, snappers, and other species come to partake in a symbiotic relationship with the shrimps that “clean off” or eat the parasites living on their bodies. It is also possible to see blacktip- and whitetip reef sharks sometimes.

The coral garden is also an ideal location for a night dive.



# TULAMBEN DROP OFF

**VISIBILITY: 15-25 M**  
**CURRENT: NONE - MODERATE**  
**40 MIN FROM ALAM ANDA**

The large wall of Tulamben also called “Drop Off”, is one of the most popular dive sites in the Northern part of Bali. The reef descends from 3 meters down to 40 meters deep; the sheer wall was created by the lava flow from the eruption of Mount Agung in 1963. The dive starts in a shallow bay and after several meters reaches the drop off with many overhangs. You can encounter “cleaning stations”, as well as a multitude of enormous, vibrantly colored sponges and gorgonians. The dive continues to an undulating plateau of coral where you can find morays, mantis shrimp, and varieties of pipefish hiding in the crevices.



# TULAMBEN BATU KELEBIT

**VISIBILITY: 25-30M**  
**CURRENT: EASY-MODERATE**  
**40 MIN FROM ALAM ANDA**

Batu Kelebit (Ulami) is a view minute behind the drop-off in Tulamben. The boat ride is by a traditional Balinese "Jukung".

The site offers excellent visibility (depending on weather and currents).

The dive site offers unspoiled coral reefs and the possibility to spot reef sharks, bumphead parrotfish, and with a bit of luck even bigger marine life such as Mola Mola.

Many kinds of reef fish can be seen here and the famous tiny pygmy seahorses can be found hanging out on sea fans.

# TULAMBEN SERAYA

**VISIBILITY: 15-30M**  
**CURRENT: NONE - MODERATE**  
**45 MIN FROM ALAM ANDA**



Seraya is located close to a bay southeast of Tulamben. Seraya consists of two dive sites, to the left, and the right.

The dive starts from the shore and is well known as a paradise for macro lovers.

Photographers from all over the world love to shoot nudibranchs and other small marine critters in the volcanic black sand.

We also see seahorses, frogfish, ghost pipefish, and harlequin shrimps here.

# AMED JAPANESE SHIP WRECK

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**VISIBILITY: 10-20 M**  
**CURRENT: MODERATE**  
**90 MIN FROM ALAM ANDA**



The Japanese Wreck is located 3km southeast of Amed. The 20-meter long steel patrol ship sunk during world war II and lies now in 6-12m depth. It is colorfully encrusted with sponges and corals all over it. If you follow the descending slope, you get to a nice coral plateau at a depth of 35 meters.

The sloping reef is spectacular, particularly in the bottom section. There is even a chance to spot pygmy seahorses on sea fans.



## LOCAL SPOT BATU KARANG

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**VISIBILITY: 10-20 M**  
**CURRENT: MILD-MODERATE**  
**90 MIN FROM ALAM ANDA**

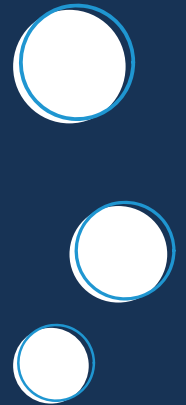
This dive site is a 20 min boat ride from Alam Anda. Considered a secret spot it is only visited by our resort. The reef starts at around 10 meters and slopes down to 30 meters. A wide range of different soft and hard corals and sponges provide a habitat for all kinds of large and small tropical fish. Sweetlips, emperor fish, parrotfish, scorpionfish, and stonefish can regularly be found there. Sometimes young reef sharks seek shelter under the coral blocks. Anglerfish and eagle rays are also residents.



## LOCAL SPOT ANGELS CANYON

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**VISIBILITY: 10-20 M**  
**CURRENT: MILD-MODERATE**  
**10 MIN FROM ALAM ANDA**



This dive site is only 10-15 min away from Alam Anda. A quiet secret spot which is mostly visited by us. Large, closely set blocks of coral reveal a fascinating Canyon landscape underwater. The corals start at a depth of 6 meters and end at approximately 30 meters. The site is covered in beautiful soft corals and feather stars. Numerous small critters like crabs and diverse nudibranchs seek shelter here. Besides the typical diversity of tropical reef fish, mackerels, batfish, sweetlips, and loads of fusiliers can be seen. Scorpionfish, cuttlefish, and moray eels round up the picture. Now and then we spot sleeping reef sharks and blue-spotted stingrays.



## LOCAL SPOT BENBEN GARDEN

**VISIBILITY: 10-15 M**  
**CURRENT: MILD-MODERATE**  
**5 MIN FROM ALAM ANDA**

Benben Garden is situated 5 minutes to the west from Alam Anda and is named after the small village next to Geretek. This dive site consists of a wonderful coral garden in the shallow waters up to 15 meters and a long stretched overhang going well over 40 meters depth.

On the eastern side of the site is a small drop-off with bigger coral blocks and sandy areas in-between.

A great site to look for macro critters but not only: Keep an eye out in the blue and you might see swarms of fusiliers and trevallies pass by. In the coral garden, you have a chance to spot mantis shrimps, special kinds of anemones, leaf scorpionfish, and giant sponges with lots of crabs. Octopuses, cuttlefish, and even nudibranchs are regularly seen here.

## LOCAL SPOT CAMPLUNG

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**VISIBILITY: 10-15 M**  
**CURRENT: EASY DRIFT DIVE**  
**10 MIN FROM ALAM ANDA**



Camplung is located on the northwest side of Alam Anda. Starting at 2 meters depth the reef turns into a sandy bottom that gradually sloped down to 20 meters and beyond. Scattered throughout the site are coral blocks both big and small. Because these coral blocks are an oasis for all kinds of marine life there is a lot to explore. You can find leaf scorpionfish, moray eels, nudibranchs, and cleaner shrimps. In the sandy area, we often spot stingrays, mantis shrimps, and ribbon eels.

## LOCAL SPOT CORAL STAIRS

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**VISIBILITY: 10-15 M**  
**CURRENT: EASY DRIFT DIVE**  
**10 MIN FROM ALAM ANDA**

Coral Stairs is located close to Angels Canyon and is named after the unique topography. The coral formation on this dive site is going down in steps from 5 to 45 meters. A very impressive and colorful picture! The coral landscape with beautiful hard- and soft corals is a great place for macro lovers. Sweetlips, juvenile sweetlips, moray eels, parrotfish, snappers, groupers, and lots of cleaner fish can be found on the stairs. Frog- and stonefish are also habitant of the reef along with small critters such as nudibranchs and glassfish.



## LOCAL SPOT GUMI CENIK

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**VISIBILITY: 10-15 M**  
**CURRENT: EASY DRIFT DIVE**  
**30 MIN FROM ALAM ANDA**

Gumi Cenik is the most further dive site we visit with our boat. It takes up to half an hour from the resort to reach this dive site.

The name translates to "small wall" which is where the dive starts. It leads to the main reef which descends to 25 meters and continues as a sandy slope. The corals are especially beautiful in the deeper parts. Schools of snappers, blue-spotted stingrays, turtles, and many smaller critters such as nudibranchs, scorpionfish, ghost pipefish, and leaf fish are often seen here.



## LOCAL SPOT LES PARADISE

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**VISIBILITY: 10-15 M**  
**CURRENT: EASY DRIFT DIVE**  
**15 MIN FROM ALAM ANDA**



Les paradise is only a 15 min boat ride to the west from Alam Anda. It consists of a long stretched reef with lots of corals, interlaced with tube- and barrel sponges which cover the first 15 meters. The reef goes down to 25 meters with a drop-off in the deep on the western end. Close to the reef is also a coral conservation project. A light current will guide you over the site. The perfect way to enjoy the multitude of underwater life in a relaxed way.

This dive site consists of a wonderful coral garden with Acropora and tube sponges, many reef fish, excellent reef noses with barrel sponges which is the home of lobster and brittle stars. In the sandy area, we can see blue-spotted and Kuhl rays, flounders, and feather stars with ghost pipefish. Also, macro life like nudibranch can be found.

## LOCAL SPOT OASIS

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**VISIBILITY: 10-15 M**  
**CURRENT: EASY DRIFT**  
**15 MIN FROM ALAM ANDA**

Oasis is located on the North of Alam Anda. The boat trip takes around 15 min. In the shallow area, the reef top is covered with coral blocks of all different sizes. They offer a beautiful variety of soft corals and much smaller and bigger crevices. Ribbon eels, scorpionfish, and bigger swarms of soldierfish, butterflyfish, and angelfish can be spotted. We even see frogfish and leaf fish here.

In the black volcano sand on the eastern side, other macro life can be found. The reef drops at around 30m steeper and ends up in an area with big schools of bannerfish, fusiliers, trevallies, and some napoleon wrasses.

## LOCAL SPOT OUT OF EDEN

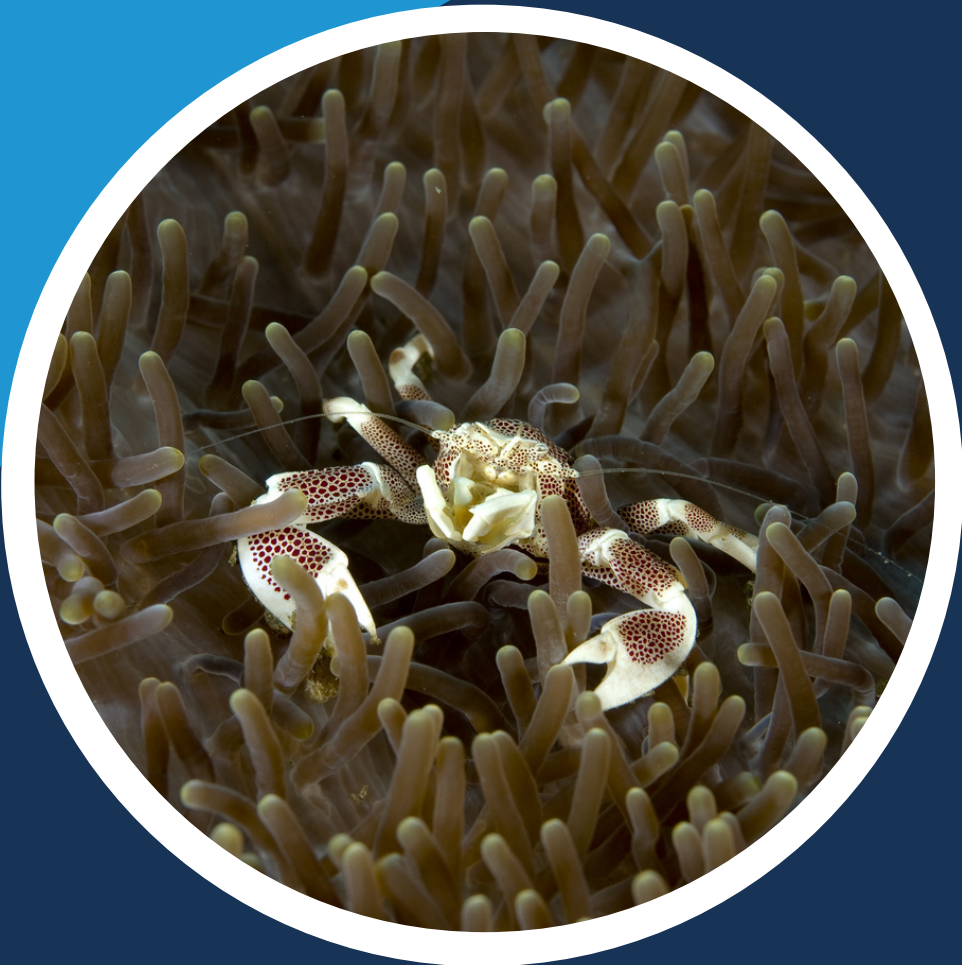
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**VISIBILITY: 10-15 M**  
**CURRENT: EASY DRIFT DIVE**  
**5 MIN FROM ALAM ANDA**

An easy drive on the south side of Alam Anda. It only takes around 5 minutes to reach the dive spot. Characteristic for this site is the beautifully overgrown blocks of corals in the shallow water. There are many colorful soft- and hard corals as well as Gorgonian sea fans.

We usually spot moray eels, ghost pipefish as well as frogfish here.

Blue-spotted stingrays are resting in the black volcanic sand and big shoals of fusiliers are swimming between the coral blocks. Another highlight is a big coral block at around 28-meter depth fully covered in sponges and sea fans with ship coral.



## LOCAL SPOT TEMBOK REEF

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**VISIBILITY: 10-15 M**  
**CURRENT: EASY DRIFT DIVE**  
**30 MIN FROM ALAM ANDA**



Close to "Out of Eden" is Tembok Reef. The dive site bears a beautiful coral field in the shallow water and the deep are several big reef noses, completely covered with *Acropora palifery*, stretching into the blue to a maximum of 30 meters. Between the corals, mantis shrimps, lobsters, cuttlefish, and octopuses are hiding. We can also spot ghost pipefish in the feather stars. Around the corals, Kuhl's rays are hiding in the sand and the blue Indian mackerels, tuna, and barracuda are passing by. This dive site is easy to dive and ends in the shallows. A popular dive site due to its beautiful corals and sponges.

## LOCAL SPOT WARU POINT

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**VISIBILITY: 10-15 M**  
**CURRENT: EASY DRIFT DIVE**  
**10 MIN FROM ALAM ANDA**

The reef starts at around 3 m on the west side and goes down to 40 meters. Moving to the east direction you will find a small reef wall that includes overhangs. Often en it pays to take a good look inside the overhand as lots of glass-fish, cleaner shrimps, and sometimes even a ribbon eel can be spotted in there. The shallower parts of the reef are nice to explore at the end of the dive. At Waru Point we can find lionfish, blue-spotted stingrays, moray eels, scorpionfish, and often macro critters like leaf-fish, ghost pipefish, and nudibranch.

# KUBU CORAL GARDEN

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**VISIBILITY: 10-20 M**  
**CURRENT: MODERATE**  
**30 MIN FROM ALAM ANDA**



The Coral Garden starts only a few meters from the shore to the right. It consists of two beautiful reef noses. The second takes us to a beautiful soft coral field.

The first nose drops slowly from 4-32 meters and is wonderfully covered in soft- and hard corals. Besides numerous tropical species of reef fish, leaf fish can be found here. There is a 15meters sandy canyon gap between the noses were nudibranchs and other macro critters. Keep an eye out in the blue for groups of barracudas passing by. Sometimes reef sharks or tunas also cruise by. The site ends after passing the soft coral field in the shallow part with sandy patches and coral blocks. Here it is possible to spot ribbon eels, octopus, lionfish, shrimps, and crabs.



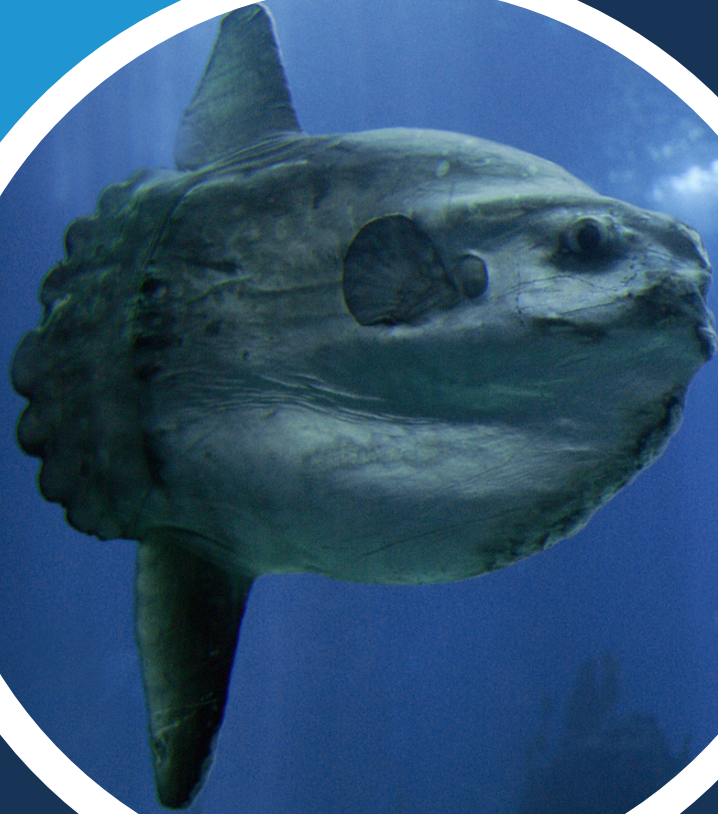
## KUBU DROP OFF

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**VISIBILITY: 10-20 M**  
**CURRENT: MODERATE**  
**30 MIN FROM ALAM ANDA**

Drop Off in Kubu is a dive site that slowly slopes down to 45 meters. The wonderful formation of hard corals with sponges growing in between make this site very special. It is not a huge dive site but starting from the deeper part making a zig-zag towards the shallow will offer an opportunity to encounter tiny pygmy seahorses, ghost pipefish, reef sharks, napoleon fish, turtles, octopus, and batfish.

In the shallower part of the reef at around 10 meters are many anemones, shrimps, nudibranchs, crabs, and with luck bump head parrotfish. Sometimes in the blue tunas, mantas, dolphins and bigger marine life pass by. A dive site that bears many surprises!



## NUSA PENIDA CRYSTAL BAY

**VISIBILITY: 20-50 M**  
**CURRENT: CAN BE STRONG**  
**FULL-DAY TRIP**

Nusa Penida Crystal Bay is a small bay directly in the channel between Nusa Penida and Nusa Ceningan at the north-western tip of Nusa Penida. In the channel, the current can be very strong and also change its direction. Up- and down current can be experienced here. Visibility ranges between 20-50m. The bay is covered in soft- and hard corals and is home to many tropical reef fish.

Regularly we can see sharks, napoleon wrasses, parrotfish, snappers, sweetlips, batfish, anglerfish, scorpionfish and many kinds of nudibranch here.

During the season there is a chance to see the famous Sunfish often called Mola Mola.

# NUSA PENIDA MANTA POINT BAY

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**VISIBILITY: 20-50 M**  
**CURRENT: SURGE**  
**FULL-DAY TRIP**

This excellent dive site situated in Nusa Penida is great for bigger marine life. It consists of a slope with nice coral and mild current which makes it an easy dive site. The highlight of this dive site is the manta rays. With luck, the manta rays can be seen year-round. They can be found in the deep, as well as a large number of them are regularly seen near to the surface.
